Sometimes you leave a meal less than satisfied, but the food still nourishes your body as you digest it. The same is true when you regularly participate in corporate worship.
- 2. It provides an opportunity to serve others. When you participate in the life of the church you are helping others through prayer or needs that may come up that you can meet.
- 3. It quietly testifies to those who may be far from God. When your neighbors see you driving out of the neighborhood or the golfer drives by the full building, they are reminded of where they should be.
- 4. It provides a natural evangelistic opportunity. When you participate regularly, it's easier to invite a friend, neighbor, or family member to join you and learn about Christ.
- 5. It encourages other followers of Jesus. Seeing each other is an encouragement that we aren't in this alone. We gather as a family so we can be all that Jesus calls us to be when we are scattered. It spurs others on towards good deeds and love.
- 6. God commands it.

Practicing the Way of Jesus Together as Family

As we said last time, being a disciple of Jesus is an **apprenticeship**, not a Christian "degree program." Jesus doesn't call us to merely download enough Bible learning to be a good person - but rather walk with Him as He shows us how to cultivate His Kingdom in the places where we live, learn, work, and play.

The author, Hugh Halter, speaks about apprenticeship in his new book <u>Righteous Brood</u>: "As a professional house painter, if I wanted to teach someone the trade, I wouldn't just hire a young man, pay him a small wage, and ask him to observe me painting for a summer. Sure, if he casually watched me from his seated position on the back of my tailgate for three or four months, he could probably explain some correct concepts about house painting to a friend. But if I wanted to make a real painter of this young man, I'd have to call him off the tailgate, give him absolutely every tool I had, and help him learn firsthand every aspect of painting. He'd have to get dirty, deal with his fears, take responsibility, and so on."

Jesus calls us to the same life - maybe not learning to paint a house, but instead, to "get up off the tailgate" and join Him where He is already working. Sounds suspiciously like what Jesus did in the Gospels, doesn't it?

This pattern of apprenticeship that we call **discipleship** is simple - yet it will take the rest of your life to practice! At FCC, we see a disciple of Jesus as "someone who is actively becoming more like Jesus by following Him in the everyday stuff of life." I often say that I want to look, sound and act more like Jesus today than I did yesterday. And tomorrow, I want to take a step even further in His direction.

To make the idea of 'practicing the way of Jesus' a bit simpler to remember, we say that as disciples, we should **BE with Jesus, BECOME like Jesus, and DO what Jesus did**. Next month, we'll break these three ideas down a little further.

Our film will be "**The Visitor**" - a story about a college professor who travels to New York City to attend a conference and finds a young immigrant couple living in his apartment. There is no need to put more money towards our trip, trust me everything is covered and some of the extra stuff is also covered. Instead, please pray as I continue to plan and lead this trip.
