A few words from Marcus...

As we get ready to say goodbye to a summer break and hello to a new school year and rhythms in life I think it would be great to remind our church family that our family is always looking to expand! My personal family experienced that last month with the addition of two new members, a son-in-law and daughter-in-law that we now love as our own. Our church family grows as we bless others with the Good News in word and deed. This has to be one of our highest priorities as a church and as individual disciples of Jesus. Why?

1. Because Christ commanded it. Typically we point to the Great Commission in Matthew 28:18-20 but there are other places in the New Testament where the priority of evangelism is clearly evident.

2. Because Christ is the only way of salvation. Jesus had an urgent, exclusive message. We must convey this hope to others.

3. Because Christ died for the world. There is a reason John 3:16 is the most familiar verse in the world. This is an urgent message worth telling.

4. Because churches that are not intentional about evangelism are weak in evangelism.

5. Because churches obsess inwardly when they fail to move outwardly. The Gospel wasn't meant for us to keep to ourselves. So our energy needs to be re-directed from inward obsessions.
6. Because churches become content and complacent with transfer growth. We can't be content with growth that is coming from Christians who move to our area. We want to reach people who are unchurched or de-churched. Transfer growth isn't evangelism; it's recirculating the saints.
7. Because evangelistic Christians actually grow stronger as better discipled Christians. Those who are evangelistic are obedient to Christ. Being obedient to Christ means that we are following his teachings and becoming a better fruit-bearing disciple.

Practicing the Way of Jesus Together as Family

We've been discussing the idea that discipleship involves re-orienting our lives around three goals: **Be with Jesus**, **Become like Jesus, and Do what Jesus did**. This month, I'd like to take a couple of minutes to talk about the last part of that goal: **Do What Jesus Did**. As we spend time getting to know Jesus, and finding that we are becoming like him - hopefully, we find that our thoughts, words, and actions become the thoughts, words, and actions of Christ.

All too often, the church promotes a concept of discipleship that says, "if you learn enough, if you do enough Bible Study, if you attend enough church services," - you become a mature disciple. This has done a great job of creating generations of "consumer Christians," - but that's not what we find as Jesus disciples those around him. His pattern of discipleship involved the invitation to be *with* him, yes, but it also involved the challenge of then living out the Kingdom - in other words, doing what he did.

The simple fact is, as a disciple of Jesus the world is looking to us to live the way Jesus did. As apprentices of Jesus, we are called to not only follow Jesus in spirit, but we are called to continue his work on earth as it is in heaven. This means healing the sick, praying for the lost, and opening up our homes and our lives to those far from God. The end goal is to do what he did.

If you'd like to explore some 'next steps' in forming your life around these practices, we invite you to be a part of what we call the "MC Experience." On Wednesday evenings this Fall, we will be offering an 8-week look at the why, what, and how of Missional Communities here at FCC. We believe that MCs are the best vehicle to developing into flourishing disciples and that they are also the best chance for us to "Find Our People." (hint, hint...) The MC Experience will begin on Wednesday, August 30th at 6:30pm.
