### A few words from Marcus...

My 2024 resolution: engage more with my neighbors on my cul-de-sac.

Research last summer done by the Pew Research Center revealed that a majority of Americans don't know most of their neighbors — and they barely talk to the ones they do know. 57% of Americans say they know only some or none of their neighbors. That share climbs up to 72% among 30- to 49-year-olds and 78% among 18- to 29-year-olds. 58% say they know their neighbors but don't spend time chatting or hanging out with them. As a result, most of the people living around us are strangers.

We're leaving our homes with our screens in our hands. The pandemic made us even less likely than we were before to stop and chat with new folks.

The benefits of knowing thy neighbor abound:

- 1. **Lives saved:** In well-connected neighborhoods, fewer lives are lost in tragedies, including <u>natural disasters</u> and <u>mass shootings</u>.
- 2. **Happier aging:** Older adults who know their neighbors <u>report</u> a far higher sense of psychological wellbeing.
- 3. Safer streets: Tight-knit neighborhoods have <u>lower rates</u> of gun violence.
- 4. **Boosted wellbeing:** People who know their neighbors are generally cheerier, healthier, and spend more time outside.

And as Christians, we've been SENT by Jesus to befriend and love our neighbors. How can we do that if we don't get to know them? I'll be the first to admit that I don't know ALL my neighbors. Of those I have met I've tried to be intentional about going more in depth with them. Some are challenging because of their unusual work schedules. I'll also admit there's one near-by that I haven't reached out to. I don't have any excuses for that one. But 2024 will be better in that regard and I challenge you to do the same.

Start by walking your neighborhood and praying for those in each home or apartment. Make a map or list of the 5-10 closest geographical neighbors. Find a way to get to know their name (besides being creepy and looking in their mailbox). Look for them to take the garbage out or get home from work and jump out to greet them (without looking like you're doing that!). If that doesn't ever seem to happen, drop off some home-made brownies and see if you can meet them. If they're not home, leave them in something protective from bugs and the elements with a note so they at least know who you are. Over time you'll get to know their names, what they do, the names of their pets. Look for opportunities to serve them, especially if they have any limitations. Snow removal, raking leaves, helping grab a runaway dog are all ways we can show love to our neighbors. Why? We are commanded to love everyone made in God's image. And well, that's everyone you ever look at. Sure, it would be great if this opens doors for talking about Jesus. That's what we should pray for. But even if they refuse to talk, our goal is still love.

Over the past few weeks, we have celebrated once again the fact God sent Jesus to restore His peace and His wholeness to all of Creation. An update from the Miriam Center, one of our ministry partners in northwest Haiti: Last Friday was the annual Christmas party for the outreach program. There were 250 families invited, which is bigger than any party we have had here for outreach. It has been raining so much we were starting to get concerned that families would not be able to come. But Friday, almost 200 parents with the child with a disability showed up. It is always so beautiful to see the parents and how they treat their kids. The party started with praising God with singing and prayer, then a very clear and simple plan of salvation was preached. For these families, who are often looked down on, for having a child that is different, what a blessing for them to hear about a Savior who loves them enough that He would come and die for them, to pay the penalty for all of our sin. Part of the outreach program is for these families to not feel alone and to know that they have a community and a

party like this, shows that they have a community and a Savior that loves them. It was so cute to see some of the kids in the program get up and sing for everyone and be cheered for. Even though there were a lot of people, thank you Jesus, everyone just felt like they were among family and friends.

I just wanted to share this, as Haiti is in the news so much and all sorts of horrific things are happening. But God is still here, He is still moving and His Word is still being preached. Please pray for boldness for those who are continually sharing the Gospel!
