Practicing the Way of Jesus Together as Family

I hope your Summer is going well. This time of year gives us one of the easiest seasons to live as Missional/Incarnational Disciples in the places where God has already sent us - walking your dog, standing around the backyard grill with your neighbors, maybe even mowing the yard of that one neighbor who can't physically keep up. All of these simple, everyday actions give us the opportunity to cultivate the shalom of the Kingdom in our neighborhoods!

Over the past couple of months, we've discussed that discipleship involves re-orienting our lives around three goals: **Be with Jesus, Become like Jesus, and Do what Jesus did**. As we spend our lives "abiding in Jesus," we will begin to see another goal form itself - to "Become Like Jesus." When we say this, we do not mean becoming people trying to **act** like Christians but being truly transformed to become more like Christ.

And catch this: we're not talking about behavior modification. This isn't just learning to say and think the "right things" or to "straighten up and act right," as my Mom would often say. This is a transformation from the inside out.

Remember, months ago, we began by saying that we are all becoming **like** someone or something. It's not a question of WHETHER we are being formed, but rather Who or What are we being formed into?

You've heard me say I want to be more like Jesus today than I was yesterday. If someone hasn't seen me or spent time with me for months or a year or several years - and today they don't see more Jesus and less Bob - then I'm heading in the wrong direction. I may only be one degree off course, but I'm still heading the wrong way.

But this type of transformation is not simple. It takes practice - and it takes practice in community. It takes our spiritual family working and growing together. We often call this "spiritual formation." That is why you will see and hear us at FCC offer a variety of discipleship opportunities like our Adult Bible Fellowships or Connect Groups, our FCC Book Club and Meeting God in the Dark - and a new addition to our D'ship pathway, the EQUIP Courses - short 4 week courses that go deeper into specific areas of following Jesus. This is also why you often hear us say that we believe the primary vehicle for growth as a disciple is our Missional Communities. In our MCs we are actively pursuing Becoming Like Jesus by living out our Core Values of Love God, Love the Family and Love your Neighbor.

UPCOMING DISCIPLESHIP OPPORTUNITIES

The June "FCC Book Club" has been postponed to Thursday, July 13th at 7pm.

This Month's "Meeting God in the Dark" will be on July 23rd from 2-5pm upstairs in the Youth Room. This month's film is "A River Run Through It". As always, this is open to those in High School and older, and childcare will be offered. Please contact the FCC Office to register and let us know if you need childcare. Feel free to bring popcorn!

FALL SNEAK PEEKs - On Wednesday evenings this Fall, we will be offering what we call the **"MC Experience"** - an 8-week look at the why, what, and how of Missional Communities here at FCC. We believe that MCs are the best vehicle to developing into flourishing disciples and that they are also the best chance for us to "Find Our People." (hint, hint...) Be watching for more information in the near future!

EQUIP courses - First announced last year, the Equip Courses are a series of short-term classes designed to encourage and equip missional disciples as they travel along their discipleship pathway. Each Equip Course is a self-contained, four-week opportunity that has no prerequisites and can be taken in any order.

The first Equip Course is **The Spiritual Formation course**, which will be offered on Thursdays at 7pm beginning September 7th. This course is a 4-week journey to help root you in your spiritual formation journey. Designed to walk you through four key components of building your relationship with Jesus every day, this course will help you to grow closer with God and set practical rhythms. The four weeks' topics include: How to Read the Bible, How to Pray, Practicing the Presence of God, and Following the Rhythms of Jesus.
