We believe there is more to the Christian life than what most people are experiencing. And that's because there really is more to the Christian life than just attending a Sunday gathering, catching an online service, or even participating in a Bible study. In fact, if you were to look in the scriptures and you were to study the life of Jesus, you would see that how He chose to make disciples was in a context of life on life, life in community, and life on mission. With that being said, if you are interested in becoming a disciple of Jesus that isn't just trying to survive this world - but one that lives the flourishing life that Jesus has for you right here in his Kingdom, we want you to consider experiencing a Missional Community.

On Wednesday evenings during September and October, we are offering an 8-week look at the why, what, and how of Missional Communities here at FCC. We believe that MCs are the best vehicle to developing into flourishing disciples and that they are also the best chance for us to "Find Our People." (hint, hint...) The MC Experience begins on Wednesday, August 30th at 6:30pm - and we hope you will join us for dinner in the Life Center at 6pm.

This month, we are adding a new discipleship environment for our FCC family - the **EQUIP Courses**. They are a series of short-term classes designed to encourage and equip missional disciples as they travel along their discipleship pathway. Each free Equip Course is a self-contained, four-week opportunity with no pre-requisites and can be taken in any order.

Mentors & Meals for the Head, Heart, and Hands (submitted by Lisa Johnson)


If you are an **analytical person** you might be interested in these stats:

- Since 2011, M&Ms has served over 1,103 middle school youth
- This year, 75% (or more) of the students who attended M&Ms achieved a "C" or better in Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies, which met our academic goal.
- M&Ms runs a 4 day/week program through the school year and a 3 day/week program during the summer on a \$262,300 budget with \$100,624 of earned income (through donations and grants) and the other \$161,668 of in-kind (un-paid) donations (ie: transportation, facility, food donations, and volunteer/staff contributions).

If you are a **Heart** person, you will be happy to learn that students at M&Ms receive homework help, snacks, meals, and some really amazing inter-generational mentorship. This summer we had an adult volunteer, Ed Bowen, who read the book "*Flora & Ulysses*" by Kate DiCamillo with our kids. For some of our students, this was the first time they have EVER read a book cover-to-cover. Ed also reached out to the author of the book and she emailed a personal note to the students and sent us 20 copies of another of her books, "*Because of Winn-Dixie*" to read for our Fall Book Club/Reading Camp.

And finally, if you are a **Hands** person, you will be interested to know over **1,456 volunteers** have dedicated **59,373 hours** toward mentoring or meal preparation at M&Ms.

Mentors & Meals is so very grateful for ALL the Head, Heart, and Hands people at **First Christian Church** who serve in the kitchen, allow us to use your facility, encourage us, and pray for our students. The M&Ms program will be starting its 13th year and welcoming our new, incoming 6th graders on September 11 and the returning 7th and 8th graders on September 18. Keep your prayers coming!
